

The report concluded with a list of projects that are being recommended to the TPC.” Rick Dickson moved to approve the meeting minutes subject to the revision and Heidi Fischer seconded the motion. Motion carried. Heidi commented that in the past there have been reports which have political commentary in reports. It was agreed that the board will encourage committee members to present objective facts in their reports. Proposed Chapter By-Law Amendments

The Executive Board proposes that the membership authorize revisions to two of our chapter bylaws. These changes are proposed to better reflect our current practices.

Article VI, Section 11 of our by-laws specifies the dates for nominating and electing chapter officers. These dates are based on our former calendar-year based terms. Our recent change to an administrative year from July 1 to June 30 requires adjusting the by-laws in this regard. The by-laws also should be adjusted to specify the process for recognizing the chapters's Professional of the Year and Employer of the Year. Current language is shown as stricken-through. The proposed replacement language is in bold italics.

The Nominations and Special Awards Committee shall nominate a slate of officers for consideration at the ~~third~~ ***first*** quarterly meeting. The election shall be at the ~~third~~ ***first*** quarterly meeting.

And

The committee shall also have the authority to nominate Chapter 17 members as "Professional of the Year;" ~~the Executive Board alone~~ ***a committee composed of the immediate past president, the current president and the president-elect*** shall have the authority to elect a member as "Professional of the Year."

And

The Committee shall have the authority nominate an employer as "Employer of the Year;" a committee composed of the immediate past president, the current president and the president-elect shall have the authority to elect and "Employer of the Year."

Article VI, Section 12 addresses responsibilities of the Past Presidents' Committee. Some of these functions are now being handled by other committees. To bring the by-laws in line with current practice, we propose the following language change.

"The Past Presidents Committee shall consist of a Chair, who shall be the immediate Past President, and all other active past presidents as members. The Committee ~~shall be fully informed on laws, proposed laws and regulations affecting the right of way professional. It shall keep the Executive Board informed of the above and~~ The Committee shall assure that all Chapter activities conform with International, Chapter and other legal requirements. It shall review the By-Laws and recommend the Executive Board adopt the same as necessary."

COURSE : SR/WA REVIEW STUDY SESSION AND EXAM MILWAUKEE, WI - OCTOBER 24-26, 2011

Course Description: This 3-day seminar is designed to prepare Candidates to take the SR/WA Comprehensive Examination by reviewing the 7 core disciplines of the right of way profession. It is intended to allow participants to brush up on areas in which they may have limited experience or knowledge. It is not intended to replace the education which participants would receive through IRWA's courses in these disciplines.

The Comprehensive Exam will be administered at the conclusion of the review session, and covers the seven core disciplines: Engineering, Law, Negotiation, Valuation, Environment, Relocation and Asset Management.

Prerequisite: All participants must be confirmed as active candidates for the SR/WA designation prior to registering for this session. If you have not yet declared your active candidacy for the SR/WA designation, please contact your chapter's PDC Chair or Francis Vicente, Credentialing Manager, at 310-538-0233 X 123.

Course Tuition Includes: Participant's Manual.

Recommended Materials: Principles of Right of Way Textbook

Facilitator David E.
